Dear Friends,

Now is the time of God's favor, now is the day of salvation. (2 Corinthians 6:2)

"Now! Now!" Two times this word is spoken to us in this verse. There is an urgency in this call. We feel the passion and insistence of the one calling to us: "Now!" It's crucial that we don't miss the right moment! Whenever we hear about us being lost and doomed in our sin and what God has done about it, whenever the message of our rescue through Jesus Christ reaches us, we need to be wide awake and very attentive. God offers us time with Himself and that can only be good. It's God's time of favor, full of His love and grace. That is pleasant and satisfying to our soul. It's time spent with the Lord and King of our life. The One calling reaches out to us still: "Be reconciled with God! Come back into communion with Him. Receive new life, love, forgiveness, comfort, hope, peace and unfading joy."

How do we respond: "I don't have time for that now. I'm too busy. That's enough on a Sunday sometime...!" The famous German Lutheran composer 300 years ago, J.S. Bach sang: Blinded mind, turn back now / so that this very hour does not find you unprepared!* The End of the church year, with the attention fixed on the end of the world reminds us of our mortality. It brings to our mind the coming judgment and life with God (or apart from Him) in eternity. Bach continued: Today you live, today be converted, / before tomorrow comes, things could change.*

It's comforting to hear God's Word and the Good News: He still calls us. He still invites us. He still has the best for us in His mind: Time with Himself, now—right now—and in eternity. He is the best thing that could ever happen to us. God's favor is God Himself. Salvation means being together with our Savior Jesus Christ. May we never miss time with the Lord. May we never be found wandering away from God. May we always be ready for Christ's return.

We pray with Bach: Help, oh Lord Jesus, help me / so this day I may come to you / and in a moment do penance / before swift death overtakes me, / so that in this way today and at all times / I may be ready for my journey home.* Have a happy and blessed End times, your *(J.S. 5 Important Things the Lutheran Reformers Wrote

... and why they're still important today In this issue: #2 **The Small and Large Catechism** – Martin Luther led a team of people to see how well congregations were doing making sure people got the good news of Jesus. They found that many Christians in their territories didn't know the most basic parts of the faith. Luther wrote the Small Catechism so families would have a handy summary of the Christian faith. He wrote the Large Catechism so pastors could learn to preach so that people would have faith.

Important Things Luther Said ... and what he meant by it ,,The Law says, 'do this' and it's never done.

Grace, 'believe in this' and everything is already done."

Heidelberg Disputation (1518)

This shows how important Luther believed it to be that Christians understand the difference between God's law and the Gospel. A life free to serve others begins with this. No matter how well you keep the law, only the free gift of the Gospel can save you. (both *taken from the Lutheran Handbook by Augsburg Fortress*)
