Dear members and friends of our ALCB,

At first glance, nothing happens in Brussels in July and August. And it's true, many people are on holidays, there is no school and the city is empty aside from tourists. Our church was the last two months on summer holidays, too. But at second glance, summer is also the time of major changes. The biggest change is that we "lost" our Pastor Matthias Tepper. He was called back by his church of origin in Germany into a new ministry in Plauen (Saxony). Now, after nearly ten years, several things will be different. Not least the fact that I will be the interim pastor for the coming time.



September is now upon us. The big changes which were developing over the last weeks become real: the next school year starts, children attend school for the very first time in their lives or go to secondary school or young adults start university, some people moved to a new place and home for a new job or or or... In our congregation we also take a fresh start. First, of course, we will start with regularly services again every Sunday. But without Pastor Matthias and the end

of the mission project we will focus more on the development of our congregation. I'd like to start a process of discussion with the elders and with you to reflect on our values and aims, our church family and how we can be a good "church for strangers", like we all are. This might affect our services (liturgy) as well as our website and PR. A big question will also be how we will be able to finance our congregation without a contribution from our partner churches in Germany and the USA. Furthermore we have been asked by the German Protestant congregation we are renting the church building for our services from, to move our service time to 15:00-17:00 as of October. - You can see: we are headed for some big challenges in the nearer future.

But we don't have to be afraid of these changes and we don't have to be desperate. In Psalm 127 the Bible tells us "Unless the Lord builds the house, the builders labor in vain. Unless the Lord watches over the city, the guards stand watch in vain." This means also: If the Lord is "on board", the labor will be successful. We take on these challenges with a prayer on our lips and with the confidence and the faith that the Lord is on our side, everywhere

in the world. What the Lord promises he will do and he promised us that we are his people and that we do this work in his name. That's encouragement and incentive enough to roll up our sleeves and to start into this future with a joyful heart. – This may grant us the almighty and merciful God.
